

**DIRECTOR'S REMARKS:** Sandy thanked everyone for attending. ## Car Show Rules

- Rain or Shine: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class depending upon the number of vehicles registered in each class.
- <u>Lunch Tickets:</u> Each registered car owner will receive one free lunch ticket. The lunch ticket will entitle the person to receive the following from **Red**, **Hot & Blue**, who will be serving food:
  - 1) One Beef, Chicken or Pork Sandwich
  - 2) One Side order of Beans or Potato Salad and Cole Slaw
  - 3) One Drink including bottle water

Anyone without a lunch ticket will pay Red, Hot & Blue directly at the time of their purchase.

#### NEWS FROM THE CHIEF JUDGE CHANGES IN JUDGING RULES – NOW & 2017 BY WILLIAM C. "BILL" ANDERSON, P.E.

The Cadillac & LaSalle Club Board of Directors approved a program in January 2015 authorizing significant changes in the judging of cars at CLC National Events. The Judging Committee is hard at work developing the procedures to implement these changes.

### 2016

The judging at the Grand National in Las Vegas in April and the Fall Festival in September embrace some of these changes including:

- Cars entered in Touring are not excluded from a first place prize or forced to compete in the Primary Division if they score more than 92 points.
- All judges' scores are counted; no longer are the high and low judges' results excluded when determining a car's score.
- Judges can collaborate with each other when judging cars.
- Judges must attend a 2-hour seminar for training the day before cars are judged.
- This is the last year for the Senior Division and the Senior Classes; in 2017 they will be included in the Primary Division.

### 2017

More changes will be phased in with the 2017 Grand National and Fall Festival Events including:

- Cars up to 2007 can be entered in the Touring Class
- Two different judging forms will be used in 2017 for Primary and Touring Divisions one for cars in 1966 and before and different form for 1967 cars and after.
- All cars that receive the required points for an award will receive that award regardless of the number of cars qualifying for a particular award.
- Cars entered in the Primary Division can win a Senior, Senior Wreath or a Senior Crown award the first time they are shown if they achieve the points required – Senior Crown 99 to 100 points, Senior Wreath 97 to 98 points, and Senior 95 to 96 points. The medallions and adornments will continue, but there will be new trophies for these three Senior Awards. A special award will be awarded to Senior Crown cars that obtain 98 points or more when shown after achieving the Senior Crown prize..
- A Specialty & Unique Division has been created for concept cars and special models, such as pickups and station wagons.
- Modified cars will be judged in four classes Hot Rods, Restomods, Mild Customs and Radical Customs
   – using procedures and judging forms specifically developed for them. First, Second, and Third prizes
   will be awarded in each class.

In the 1990s, I worked for Michelin as a Quality Assurance manager for the GM account in Detroit. I was often in the Arlington, Texas plant that built the Fleetwoods, including December 1996 when the last Roadmasters, Caprices, SSs, and Fleetwoods came off the line in advance of the hurried changeover to full-size SUV production.

I remember Cadillac lending our Michelin office in Troy, Michigan a pre-production 1993 RWD Fleetwood sometime late summer or early fall of 1992. I got to take it home for the night. It was a super comfortable luxurious cruiser and the ride was a huge improvement over the prior RWD Fleetwood. The other big thrill back in the day was Cadillac lending our office a brand new 1992 Seville and Eldorado Touring Coupe for a few days. That '92 Seville was such a stunning car (inside and out) and an extremely radical change for Cadillac back then. It is a shame they advanced their design so far forward in '92 with the Seville and have ever since have lost traction.

Let's hope the division under the direction of Johan De Nysschen can bring a successful "Audiesque" sustainable design direction to Cadillac, a design direction that would finally bring continuity of design and sales success to Cadillac. I often ride in the XTS with my UberBLACK account. What a huge disappointment -- mediocre design and engineering. The suspensions and interiors are not much better than what are used and executed in \$25k Camry / Accords. This results in a very uninspiring car. We have seen the sustainable miracle De Nysschen has pulled off at Audi. I can only hope he can do the same to *finally* change Cadillac, and for the first time in decades, enable Cadillac to create the stature to genuinely compete with Tier One Luxury brands.

Some of you may have noticed a special, one-off car among the beauties showcased in the San Diego Automotive Museum gallery piece. It's Louie Mattar's \$75,000 1947 custom Cadillac. In 1952, Mattar and two other men drove this oneof-a-kind Caddy from San Diego to New York and back, without a single stop. Their trip totaled 6,320 miles!

Mr. Mattar worked 5 years on modifying his 1947 Cadillac, which, by the time it was completed, turned into quite a unique car. For examples, the Caddy automatically refills the radiator and changes the oil. Having drilled axles, the wheels could be inflated while turning and, also, hydraulic jacks could raise the car to allow the wheels to be changed while moving.

Driving more than 6,000 miles non-stop can take its toll on a car, so, for more complicated repairs and adjustments, the hood featured clear panels, which allowed the driver to keep on going, while the other two passengers fiddled under the bonnet, standing on movable platforms attached to the side of the car.

Aside from setting the aforementioned crosscountry endurance record, Louie's Cadillac is considered to be the first motorhome ever built. The three men who completed the grueling journey had a rolling home at their disposal. The modified Cadillac featured many luxuries such as an electric stove, refrigerator, TV, washing machine, chemical toilet, shower, medicine cabinet and kitchen sink. They even had an ironing board, all integrated into the back seat.

Up front, the car had a nationwide mobile telephone, PA system, tape recorder and a Turkish pipe. Not many modern cars feature



such a varied equipment list, let alone a complete bar for those moments when monotony and homesickness struck.



The shiny trailer held a 30-gallon reserve of water (50 gallons were in a tank mounted in the car), 230 gallons of gas and 15 gallons of oil, meaning that it needed refueling only three times during the week-long trip (September 20-27, 1952), done of course while moving, on airfields located in Kansas City, Camden and Omaha.

Two years later, the same car was also driven non-stop from Anchorage to Mexico City, over a distance of 7,482 miles.

### ARE THE DAYS OF POLE-MOUNTED OLD CARS NUMBERED? BY DANIEL STROHL HEMMINGS DAILY UPDATED MARCH 4, 2016

Used to be – back in the days when distinctive vehicles could be had for cheap or free – if you wanted to really attract the eye of passersby to your place of business, you slathered some house paint on some old car, stuck it up on a pole, and became an instant local landmark. But those landmarks are slowly disappearing and it seems we may in our lifetimes see the end of the car-on-a-stick phenomenon.

We've pointed out plenty of similar vehicles in the past – the Crosleyonnastick in Barrington, New Hampshire; the Renault Dauphine in Bowling Green, Kentucky; the pink Avenger kit car in Belleville, Ontario; another Croslevonnastick in Mechanicville, Virginia; even more Crosleyonnasticks across the country; the Volkswagen Beetle atop Queen Connie in Brandon, Vermont: the Chevrolet DeLuxe Fleetline somewhere in Pennsylvania; the Model A speedster in British Columbia; the Crosleyonnaroof in Tacoma, Washington; the Hupmobile in Queens; and the homebuilt fiberglass car in Saginaw, Texas -


While discussing the 1955 Cadillac Coupe de Ville pictured left that a couple of enterprising restorers had removed from a Texas rooftop, it seemed plenty of us knew of a car or truck hoisted up on high decades ago and used as a sign for a local business – sometimes for dining establishments, but more often for junkyards, car repair shops, and other auto-related companies. Regular reader Don Homuth shared the photo below of the neon-outlined 1959 Cadillac Series 62 out front of a diner on Market Street in Salem, Oregon.

But as Speedzzter noted in the comments to the Coupe de Ville story, these cars on poles and cars on roofs seem to be an endangered species.

I miss old cars on top of buildings, pylons, and plinths. Modern sign regulations prohibit new installs in most locales. The few that still exist are mostly "grandfathered" in. It's more than just sign regulations, too. Development threatens many of the cars, such as the Mechanicville Crosleyonnastick, and the constant exposure to the elements will cause many to deteriorate to the point where they have to come down for safety's sake. Meanwhile, plenty of the cars and trucks have become more highly sought after in the years they spent up high than when they were installed atop their poles and roofs - for example, the Coupe de Ville that started this conversation or the AMX/2 pushmobile concept car that once graced a pole in Ephrata, Pennsylvania (and, kind of along those lines, Paul Gorrell's former Crosley sign turned scooter).

It becomes quickly apparent while perusing the photos of the cars still mounted on poles that most, if not all, of them have sat upon their perches for decades, which means that few, if any, business owners are relying on this old gimmick to bring in customers these days.

Speedzzter wondered just what modern vehicles would be interesting enough to use for signs ("Who would want to see a minivan or an SUV atop a building or sign in 2040?" he asked), but we have to wonder what vehicles will ever be both distinctive enough and worthless enough to use for signs.

To be sure, some will evade the developer's wrecking ball, and some will be more effort to restore than they're worth, so they'll remain in place for decades to come, maybe with a new coat of paint or a new string of holiday lights, but they'll be the rare exceptions. More will come down, and with them will disappear a little bit more character and color from the American landscape.


