




LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Sandy also welcomed new members and first-time meeting attendees: Paul Gass, owner of a 1959 Hess & Eisenhardt Hearse from Baltimore, MD and Steve Clay, from nearby Glenn Dale, MD with a 1949 Series 62 Club Coupe. Steve, who has been a CLC (national) member, joined our Region at the Auto Show.

Sandy reminded everyone about the CLC Judges' Workshop on this Saturday, April 29th at the Hilton McLean Tysons Corner. CLC Director of Technical Services and CLC Chief Judge Bill Anderson said that he will accept late registrations, but it is imperative that anyone who is not registered, but would like to attend must contact Bill on Tuesday at (443) 994-5455 or Rivsrgr8@aol.com. The registration form is only available on the CLC-PR website: http://clcpotomacregion.org/forms/2017CLCJudgesWorkshop.pdf. To pay the Workshop fee, one must call the CLC Office with credit card payment or pay Bill by check. Also, attendees need to study the 2017 Judging Manual and bring it to the seminar for the open book test as part of the Workshop. The Judging Manual is available as 70 page download from the CLC website or color, spiral bound available from Bill for \$30.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Minutes from the March 2017 meeting were not read since they were published and distributed to all members in the April 2017 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the March meeting to date. The Region's income was \$60.64. The total expenses for the same time period were \$254.15.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: To date, we have 186 members for 2017. Welcome to our newest members: the aforementioned Steve Clay, and Paul Gass, plus Kendrick T. Gibbs, owner of a 1970 Deville Convertible, from Fort Washington, MD.

ACTIVITIES REPORT: The following activities were discussed:

- 1. Recent Events:
 - 47th Annual AACA Sugarloaf Mountain Region Parts Meet, Carroll County Agriculture Center, Westminster MD, Fri-Sat, Mar 24-25. Richard Sisson went to this meet and was very impressed with the facility and the number of vendors. He said that it was well-attended.





- The Southern Knights 30th Annual Coming Out Car & Bike Show, Charlotte Hall, MD, Sun, Apr 2. This is one of the first outdoor car shows of the season. Dan Ruby said that there were about 15 Cadillacs in this show.
- 4th Annual Kensington Car Show, Howard Ave, Kensington, MD, Sun, Apr 9. PR member Randy Denchfield participated with his 1935 LaSalle. There were over 300 cars.
- CLC-Valley Forge Region Dealer Show at Cadillac of Turnersville, (New Jersey), Sat, Apr 22. Our Region's liaison to the VFR, Lynn Gardiner, had hoped to attend but the weather was bad. He spoke to Ronnie Hux who said that they had 14 cars only.

- Sandy reminded everyone that the Region will not be holding our annual car shows at
 Capitol Cadillac in 2017 in order to commit our resources to the Grand National.
 However, we are still considering a "cars and coffee" type of event at Capitol Cadillac
 during 2017. This event would not require the amount of work as a car show and it would
 keep our annual tradition of having our cars on display here at Capitol Cadillac.

GRAND NATIONAL 2017:

- 1. Bill Anderson said that we need a sponsor(s) for the nine (9) trophies for the Modified Class. The total cost is \$1,500. The sponsors name will be affixed to each trophy.
- 2. Lynn Gardiner conveyed two requests from GN Chair Ronnie Hux:
 - i. We need volunteers to assist the GN photographer Alan Clark with the staging of the cars to be photographed. Currently we envision a need for three (3) volunteers for each of two (2) shifts per day: 10 am 1 pm & 1 pm 4 pm.
 - ii. Spread the word! Don't mail any GN registrations via USPS priority, certified, registered or any mail method that requires the signature of the recipient. The address for the registrar is a PO box so there is no one is available to sign for the mail and it will be returned.





Below is the update, as of Sunday, April 16, from GN Chair Ronnie Hux.

- 279 member registrations have been received. With these registrations are: 205 spouses/partners, 69 additional guests and 26 children for a total of 579. Additionally, 50 members and 47 spouses/partners are 1st time attendees. We are at about 60% of our expected member registrations. Based upon room reservations we are about 55% 60% into member registrations.
- 2. There are 265 cars registered: 147 primary class, 35 touring class, 7 specialty and unique class, 13 modified class and 63 display only. Also of note there are 18 1959-1960 Cadillacs registered and 29 1930-1939 Cadillacs registered. We also have a 1903, 1914, and 1929 registered. A lot of older cars are expected.
- 3. We are expecting many unusual and unique cars at our show. Richard Sills has arranged with the AACA Museum to transport Betty White's 1977 Cadillac Seville to our event for display. This is an original car with an awesome story. (The Potomac Region has provided an annual sponsorship to the AACA Museum for this car since 2009.) There are other display cars that will be announced as we get closer to the GN.
- 4. We have trailer storage arranged. The General Manager at the Westin assisted us with obtaining the paved back lot at George Marshall High School adjacent to the Westin on Leesburg Pike. The lot is very secure and there is perimeter fencing around the majority of the lot. Our shuttle van can easily circle through the lot as it travels to and from the Westin and Hilton. It was a great achievement to find this property.
- 5. The Hilton remains sold out with 405 room nights booked and the Westin is holding at 95. We can go to 125 at the Westin under our contract.
- 6. The Judge's Workshop on April 29 at the Hilton, McLean, VA has 28 registrants.
- 7. The Potomac River Dinner Cruise is sold out! No more seats are available. Many other tours are approaching capacity as well, including the following (April 7th figures): 61 have signed up for the USA Parts tour (29 in caravan and 32 via bus) and 97 for the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum tour on Friday morning
- 8. The outdoor flea market only has one (1) spot left unsold and only eight (8) spots of the indoor flea markets are left
- 9. Ads for the program book are starting to be sold, but we need everyone to help sell at least one ad.
- 10. The goody bags, lanyards and badge holders have been received, and the majority of the table decorations (for Wednesday night, Friday night, Lady's Tea & Style show, and Saturday night) and various signs that are needed are ready for the event.
- 11.We have received items for the goody bags from TD Bank, Pollock Restoration, Apple Hydraulic, Steel Rubber, and Cadillac Parts and Restoration. We need more items!
- 12.Pre-event sales of polo shirts and tee shirts are selling rapidly. It seems that most everyone is ordering one or two with each registration. T-shirts are selling equally to the polo shirts. We will be bringing some extras to the GN for sale, but not an abundance as they are not that desirable after the event. If you want several, it is best to order from Vicky Barruzza and prepay NOW. We will also have some "official" baseball caps like the one shared at our last GN meeting. The caps are \$20 with same embroidery work as our shirts. There has been much interest in the official poster.





- 13. Thanks to Christopher Winter for securing a donation of 4,000 bottles of water from Fastenal. Also, Cadillac Parts & Restoration is donating 650 bottles of water for the judges to use on Saturday.
- 14.Cadillac Parts & Restoration has paid for the judges' pins and they have been ordered by Bill Anderson, Mike Book and Ronnie Hux.
- 15.On June 17th we will hold another pre-event planning meeting at the Hilton, McLean, VA from 2:00 4:30pm. At this meeting, Scot Minesinger will be notifying everyone who is volunteering what tasks they will be asked to do.
- 16.Ronnie has had weekly conversations with Cadillac representatives and their official advertising agency, Jack Morton Advertising, Cadillac regarding requirements for their contribution and participation in our 2017 GN. We are complying with their requirements for table decorations, etc. There are going to be a couple of possible surprises announced within a few weeks. Cadillac wants the Wednesday reception to be "elegant" and to "Cadillac standards." Cadillac is VERY interested in our event due to the anticipated attendance and location.
- 17.We have received commitments for a Platinum Sponsorship from Daniel Jobe and Capitol Renegade Trailers, a Sponsorship from Fairfax County Visitors & Convention Bureau, and several personal sponsorships have been received or committed, including sponsorships from several CLC members. [Dan Ruby suggested that the GN Committee contact Mike Cannon at USA Parts regarding possible sponsorship, advertising and goody bag contributions.]

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. In the April newsletter, we reported the story of John Shuffield's accident in his 1959 Series 62 Convertible. The story resulted in a lot of replies from Region members, in particular Randy Edison, James Fournier and Jack McClow, discussing the best ways to show John our support and best wishes. James was able to contact John's daughter-in-law in California. She informed him that Mr. Shuffield really appreciates our club reaching out to him. Since he is not a National CLC member, it was decided to purchase him a membership and send him a care package containing back issues of *The Self-Starter*, particularly issues with articles on 1959 Cadillacs. Special thanks to James, Randy and Jack, along with CLC Past President Lars Kneller, for working together on the care package.
- 2. Randy Denchfield mentioned that longtime Potomac Region member Richard Sisson will be moving out-of-state sometime in the coming weeks. He suggested that the Region hold a farewell gathering in Richard's honor. No date or location was suggested.

AUTO FANATICS USE ORCUTT CAR SHOW TO HELP RAISE FUNDS
TO FIX CRUMPLED CLASSIC CADILLAC

A candy apple-red Cadillac convertible stood out among the dozens of shiny, perfectly restored classic cars on display Saturday in Orcutt, California but not because of its pristine condition. Instead, the 1959 Cadillac's crumpled front end prompted even non-car buffs to wince. The car show appearance came nine days after the Cadillac slammed into a concrete pole on Clark Avenue at Highway 135 and before its owner and driver, John Shuffield, has even left the hospital.

"It's an iconic piece for the local community here," said Shuffield's

grandson, Chad. "It's a piece of the family that's for sure." In fact, the hospitalized 87-year-old owner fretted about needing to get the car restored quickly so it wouldn't miss Saturday's event.

The 6th Annual St. Patrick's Day Car Show at St. Louis de Montfort Church raises money to provide scholarships for students at St. Louis de Montfort Catholic School and St. Joseph High School, in addition to other youth programs. The Knights of Columbus 11137 — a fraternal organization James Jepsen likened to the Catholics' Elks — organized the event. While not huge, the scholarships help ease families' financial burden, Jepsen said, noting the program would have assisted his parents when he was in high school.

Approximately 125 classic vehicles sat on display while booths offered food, beverages and information. But Saturday's gathering had a secondary purpose as the Shuffield family set up a booth seeking donations to help pay for the car's restoration. Shuffield and his Cadillac have attended five of the six shows.





"Everybody knows John in the car show community ...," Jepsen said. "So many people want to help." Upon learning of the crash and seeing photos of the vintage car, he said he knew immediately who owned the vehicle.

His first thought centered on Shuffield's condition, knowing the car didn't have modern-day seatbelt or airbags, and before learning the octogenarian driver had to airlifted to Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital. Shuffield remained at Cottage Hospital on Saturday, but his family hopes he will be transferred to a rehabilitation facility within days.

"The next question in my mind was, 'Wow. How bad is the Caddy?'" Jepsen said. "We saw the pictures, but when you see these things they're built like tanks compared to today's cars."

Since the car can't be driven, Santa Maria Towing provided free transportation to get the Cadillac to the church for the car show.

Chad Shuffield said his grandfather has owned the car, previously owned by Alex Madonna, since approximately 1987. Cost may not be the only impediment to restoring the classic vehicle. "A car this old, parts don't come cheap" Jepsen said. "They're hard to find." The Shuffields don't know yet how much it will cost to restore the Cadillac, but they say it will be paid by the insurance company of the driver who caused the crash.

Organizers of Saturday's event also allowed the Shuffields to set up a booth to collect donations.

"I haven't even got into the numbers of it yet, but it's pricey," Chad Shuffield added.

ARMED HOME INVADERS SWIPE ELDERLY MAN'S CLASSIC CADILLAC FROM NORTHEAST PHILADELPHIA HOME BY DAN STAMM AND DAVID CHANG APRIL 13, 2017

Robbers took a safe, a gun and a classic car from an elderly widower's Northeast Philadelphia home overnight. And, police said the victim may have been set up. The attack inside the Korean War veteran's home on Chapelcroft Street in the Bustleton neighborhood early Wednesday left Pete Labuda, 88, with some scrapes, police said. Labuda told reporters outside his home of 40 years Wednesday morning that he feared for his life during the attack. "I thought they were gonna kill me in there," Labuda said.

Police responded around 3:30 a.m. after Labuda managed to free himself.

Investigators say the ordeal began when Labuda's acquaintance who ran errands for him greeted him at the door around 3:00 a.m.

"He knew a female that was at the door and he was kind of surprised by her visit that early in the morning," Philadelphia Police Lieutenant Dennis Rosenbaum said. When Labuda answered the door, two men armed with guns pushed him into the home and tied his wrists and ankles to a kitchen chair, using tape as well as a phone cord, police said. "They had guns and handcuffed me," Labuda said. "Threw me on the floor. I couldn't get up."

Labuda had his gun on him when he answered the door but didn't have time to draw it. Once the man was tied up, the robbers took the gun and a safe that contained the victim's dead wife's jewelry and between \$25,000 to \$30,000 dollars' worth of cash, police said. The burglars then went to the garage and took the man's mint-condition classic car.

"It's a 1985 Fleetwood Chrome Cadillac, its baby blue in color and it has a dark blue vinyl top," Philadelphia Police Chief Inspector Scott Small said. "It also has spoked hubcaps."









The car turned up later Wednesday on Emerald Street in Port Richmond. "They set up surveillance on the car," Rosenbaum said. "Shortly thereafter a male was caught going into the car. They saw him come from a house. Myself and other detectives arrived on location. We tried to knock on that door. A male tried to flee from that house."

Police took two men from the house into

custody. They are considered persons of interest. Labuda said he didn't recognize the men however. "It happened so fast and with his age they kind of overtook him so fast," Rosenbaum said.

Police searched the Emerald Street home Wednesday night. Investigators are now searching for the woman who initially greeted Labuda at the door. They believe she could have been involved in the robbery. "He may have been setup," Small said.

Labuda's neighbor Abdul Maaf described him as a watchful eye in the community who is always quick to share a story. "He's an older man and they took advantage of that," Maaf said. "He served for our country and I thank him for that. He always tells me his war stories. He always tells me about how he grew up here."

Later Wednesday, the Veterans group Warriors' Watch Riders organized a large show of support outside Labuda's home. Residents greeted Labuda at his door and showed their appreciation. "What happened today should never happen to any veteran or anybody," Bob Crawford, one of the organizers, said. "He's overwhelmed seeing everybody out here."

Game Show host Allen Ludden purchased a new Cadillac Seville for his actress wife Betty White in May 1977. The car was ordered in the custom color, Seamist Green, from Martin Cadillac in Los Angeles, California. It was given to her as a surprise gift. The vehicle sported a mere 14.3 miles when it was driven off the dealership's lot.

After 25 years of ownership, Betty donated the Cadillac to a charity from which it was purchased by a private collector who owned it for several years. The car's last private owner, CLC Potomac Region member Nicholas Ferrantino, of Houston, Texas, presented it to the AACA Museum in 2009 with less than 18,000 miles on the odometer. It continues to be in superb condition looking like it did when Betty White took possession of it.

The car was added to the AACA Museum's Adopt-a-Car program where an organization and/or an individual can contribute \$500 to help support the car for one year. The contribution covers some of the costs of insurance, any required mechanical work, supplies to keep the car in show room condition and other costs. 


