Best of Show was a 1969 nine-passenger Fleetwood Station Wagon owner by Butch Sevila of Great Falls, Virginia. The California car has undergone a full restoration and was stunning. Best Post War Early went to John Paris of Clinton, Maryland for a 1949 Series 60 Special and Best Post War Late was awarded to Maurice Jones of Washington, DC for his one-owner 1976 Fleetwood Brougham.

This was the first show at Capitol Cadillac since the 2017 Grand National in McLean, Virginia, and the show picked up right where the Grand National left off. Thanks to Daniel Jobe and Capitol Cadillac for their continued support; thanks to all the volunteers who worked the show; thanks to all the auction donors / buyers and thanks to all the attendees.

Next year's Spring show will commemorate Capitol Cadillac's 85th anniversary.

#### CLC VALLEY FORGE REGION CAR SHOW CADILLAC OF TURNERSVILLE, NEW JERSEY STORY AND PHOTOS BY LYNN GARDNER

On Saturday, April 28th, the CLC Valley Forge Region Car Show held its annual car show at Cadillac of Turnersville, New Jersey. It was a resounding success with sunny and cool weather resulting in 24 Cadillacs and LaSalles on display. The management and staff were great hosts providing the venue for the event. Among the outstanding examples of pre-war Cadillacs and LaSalles on display were John Barry's 1940 LaSalle Series 50, Thomas Bottley's 1940 Series 60 Special and Marty Watkins' 1941 Series 60 Special (Best of Show Early). A trio of 1950's convertibles graced the show including Chris Heldt's 1950 Series 62, Joe Alcorn's 1955 Series 62 and Ed McGrettgan's 1959 Series 62. A number of great cars from the 1960's were present including Mike Lizzio's 1960 Fleetwood, Mike Barruzza's 1967 Deville Convertible, Craig Perrotty's 1967 Deville Convertible (Dealer's Choice) and Gerald Carroll's 1969 Superior Hearse. Many fine examples of the 1970's graced the field including Bob Neisser's 1976 Coupe deVille (Best of Show Late), Mike Stinson's 1976 Firethorn Red Fleetwood and Joe Caristo's outstanding 1978 Eldorado two-tone Classic Biarritz. Ed McBride attended with his black 1980 Fleetwood with a banner displaying the late Frank Rizzo, who served as Philadelphia's Mayor and Police Commissioner. Another tribute was on display with Fern DiBacco's 1976 Eldorado convertible, which is painted like an American flag in tribute to our Veterans and in memory of 9/11. Symbolic of our flag were three Allantés in red (Ed Tuso's 1993 Allanté), white (Mike Astringa's 1992 Allanté) and blue (George Chase's 1993 Allanté).

It was a weekend full of car shows. Two big ones were scheduled for Sunday, May 6th and we were trying to figure out how to divide our day. Add to that the forecast was for a lot of rain. Then the Kensington Car Show was rescheduled for the following week. Whew! That simplified things. We made plans to go to Greenbelt, MD for the Cadillac & LaSalle Club Potomac Region Spring Show and Automobilia Auction at Capitol Cadillac. But rain was still very much an issue. And vacuum windshield wipers are not much fun on the Beltway. So, I was wondering which mighty motorized mode of transportation Randy would choose to battle the elements. He picked "Charlie" as we affectionately refer to our 1948 Series 61 Club Coupe that we acquired from Charlie Lightbown shortly before he died (Charlie had hounded Randy for years to buy that car).

The rain held off! It was a lovely day even though it was cloudy. "Charlie" got us there in fine style. We were placed inside in the showroom! The turnout of 39 cars seemed a bit smaller





than usual. I think the forecast caused this. However, enthusiasm was high and there was a wonderful assortment of very large motor cars.

This yearly event has always been one of our favorites. Daniel Jobe, who is the President of Capitol Cadillac, generously donates his space, his time and the spectacular trophies for a really enjoyable day. This year's show was the 26th Annual Spring Show he has hosted and we have attended.





I had some definite favorites in the crowd. When we parked in the showroom we found ourselves next to a striking dark green 1949 Series 62 Club Coupe (pictured top right) owned by Steve Clay of Glenn Dale, MD. The seats are an exquisite tan tweed fabric. There was another 1949 in the showroom. This one seemed rare to me, a four-door sedan, 60 series. It was long, sleek and elegant. The owner is John Paris of Clinton, MD. One could just imagine the chauffeur driving his passengers around town.

Another favorite of mine was the 1956 Series 62 Sedan owned by Chris & Denise Overcash of Culpeper, VA (pictured middle right). They thoroughly enjoyed the drive to Greenbelt in the car that is as comfortable as their living room sofa. They like to call their new digs in Culpeper their Cadillac Ranch as it is nestled between a cattle ranch and a horse farm.

Red Hot & Blue was there with everyone's favorite BBQ. A new vendor, Honey Bun Cake Factory, made its delicious appearance with "Oh My Honey Bun" cakes! The club held its auction of all things Cadillac and otherwise that members donated. It raised over \$1,100. One impressive item was a painting of a 1952 Cadillac that Region member Roger Bentley painted years ago. The bidding was fast and furious, but Randy lost out to Chuck Piel on this treasure. Among the items donated were vintage brochures (Mike Fahey), antique toys / models (Jeff Gurski, Greg Huver, Josh Pinho and Burt Zwibel), original art work (Dan Reed) and miscellaneous items (Chuck Piel and Dan Ruby). Thanks to everyone who donated items. There was also a 50-50 raffle that netted \$230 for the club.

Vince Taliano, Potomac Region Director, called us all together at the end of the day to present the awards. This event is peer-judged by the participants choosing their favorites in each of several classes. This year there were no contenders in the pre-World War II category, but the other categories were well represented and there were fine trophies awarded to many wonderful cars.

At the end several special trophies were awarded. "The Man of Day" (as I refer to him) really collected a trove of these. The first award that Maurice Jones received was the "Henry Ruby Memorial Award". Each year Dan Ruby chooses the car from the show that he feels would have been his late father's very favorite car. His father was a passionate member, as is Dan.







Then, normally, the Mayor of Greenbelt, Emmett Jordan, makes an appearance and presents the "Mayor's Choice" award for his very favorite. He was unable to attend, so in his stead, Daniel Jobe presented Maurice Jones (pictured above left) with his second award of the day for his one-owner Galloway Green 1976 Fleetwood Brougham (pictured above right). To top it off, Mr. Jones' car also won the "Best Post War Late" (1965 through current time division). Maurice addressed the crowd thanking everyone for the support he and his family has received since his wife Dianne passed away.



We felt very honored when "Charlie" stole Daniel Jobe's heart and was presented with the "Dealer's Choice" award. Our "Charlie" (pictured above left) was originally sold in 1948 by Capitol Cadillac and Daniel is always happy for cars like this to come "home". Pictured above right is me and Randy receiving the award from Daniel.





"Best of Show" – the "crème de la crème" went to the really, really cool Cadillac 1969 Nine-Passenger Fleetwood Station Wagon that belongs to Butch Sevila of Great Falls, VA (pictured below to the right of Daniel). Butch said the top had to be completely reconstructed even though it was a California car. Rodents had gotten under the car cover and ate the top and nested in the headliner. It's beautiful now.

The "Antique Row" shops on Howard Avenue were open for business with many shops blending in nicely with the old cars. The book shops featured vintage car brochures and posters. Model cars were seen in store windows. Interspersed are parks and patios where live bands performed all day. Our progress in trying to see everything was slowed by running into old pals, neighbors, church friends and fellow car nuts. What fun! And then there were the DOGS! There was every imaginable variety with all on their best behavior and vying to be the cutest. Now and then a train roared by, only adding to the mood and the appreciation of mighty motorized power. The show was a great success. The entry fee for the cars went entirely to support the Noyes Children's Library in Kensington. Each entrant received a show T-shirt. There were prizes for the top 25 cars and the top five motorcycles. "Best of Show" went to a 1964 Ford Fairlane with a 427 c.i. engine.

The community is grateful to Mario Bruno for his vision and dedication to the Kensington community. I would also like to mention that Mario recently expanded his business even more. Bruno's Classic Muscle opened in Rockville, MD. With the slogan of "You dream it, We build it." Mario has taken his love of cars to a new level. We have always appreciated the quality service and workmanship of Mario's service stations. It is such a pleasure to see him going in new directions. 
