






DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Vince thanked everyone for attending. This is his last meeting to chair as Region Director. As announced in the November newsletter, PR member William "Butch" Sevila of Great Falls, VA passed away recently. Butch won Best of Show at our 2018 Spring Car Show with his 1969 nine-passenger Fleetwood Station Wagon. He also helped to raise over \$300,000 for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) with Labor Day weekend car shows. The Region donated \$100 in Butch's honor. Long-time, Baltimore-area member Ron Siegrist passed away on November 4th at the age of 93. The obituary was sent to the membership with information on a memorial service scheduled for Saturday, November 24. Also, we send our condolences to Joe Palmore on the recent passing of his mother.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Minutes from the October 2018 meeting were not read since they were published and distributed to all members in the November 2018 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the October 2018 meeting to date. The Region's income was \$2,015.39, mostly from membership renewals, and the expenses for the same time period were \$780.16 which includes the donation (\$500) to the AACA Museum to continue the Region's sponsorship of the Betty White 1977 Cadillac Seville.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: The 2019 CLC PR Membership Campaign has officially begun. On Oct 31, approximately 140 membership renewal forms were U.S. mailed to 2018 PR members who did not pre-pay for 2019. Renewal forms & payments are due by December 15th. To date, approximately 125 members have renewed for 2019. After the New Year's holiday (two week grace period after due date), we will begin contacting the stragglers, first by email with an electronic copy of their form and then by phone.

He was married to Julie for 62 years until her 2016 passing. Antique cars were his favorite hobby as they attended hundreds of car shows. A 2011 fire destroyed their Maryland home, garage and six cars, including a 1966 Eldorado (pictured left), a 1976 Eldorado Convertible and a 1946 Chevy they planned to drive to the Vintage Chevrolet Club of America's (VCCA) 50th Anniversary Meet in Flint, MI. Without missing a beat, a few days later Ron & Julie had their 1948 Chevy Fleetmaster brought from their Florida home to Maryland and drove it to Michigan. Survivors include two daughters, Susan and Carol, and five grandchildren.

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This exhibit will showcase the beauty and the glamour of the full-size American convertibles built from the immediate post-WWII years through 1976 when Cadillac produced what was then believed to be the last American convertible. During this era, the convertible symbolized youth, freedom, and the joys of the open road. Convertible drivers appeared to be unencumbered by the practicalities of ordinary life. They enjoyed seeing what was around them and also enjoyed being seen. The cars conveyed a glamorous image, even attracting some drivers who rarely put the top down, but enjoyed the status of driving a convertible. Public figures favored convertibles to be visible to the public, including President Eisenhower's ride in a 1953 Cadillac Eldorado during his inaugural parade. And for most of this period, the traditional full-sized American cars got progressively larger and more luxurious, hence the description "Land Yachts."

During the 1970s, a variety of factors caused Americans to rethink the desirability of a convertible. The prevalence of air conditioning made closed cars more comfortable in warm weather, and vinylroofed hardtops gave them a stylish, youthful appearance. Increasing crime, pollution and safety concerns also eroded Americans' will to drive open cars. And finally, government fuel economy requirements numbered the days of the "land yachts." But for those who love the style and panache of the great postwar luxury convertibles made in America, they will be alive and well represented in Hershev!

AACA MUSEUM LAND YACHTS CONVERTIBLE EXHIBIT RECEPTION BY TOM MCQUEEN


On Friday, November 16, I attended the opening of the new exhibition, "Land Yachts," at the AACA Museum. Museum Board member Richard Sills was in charge of planning the theme of the exhibit and really did a wonderful job! He also gave a brief presentation talking about the "Land Yachts" and what they symbolized, then and now. Despite the snowstorm during the week (8.5 inches in Hershey), there was a large turnout for the opening. Selected for the exhibit were a large number of Cadillacs including Mark Brodsky's '70 Deville Convertible and '53 Eldorado. CLC MEMBERS AND CADILLACS IN BERLIN BY CHRISTOPHER WINTER



I recently had the opportunity to visit Berlin, Germany for three weeks. I stayed in an apartment in the Moabit neighborhood and was able to get around the city quite well using the public transit systems. In fact, while I was in Germany, I used almost every form of conveyance: subway, train, bus, boat, tram and taxi. I was even able to catch a ride in a 1939 Cadillac coupe and a 1957 Sedan DeVille.

One of the principles of the Cadillac & LaSalle Club is fellowship with other members, including those located as far away from the United States as Berlin, Germany. Prior to leaving, I referenced the CLC International Membership Directory to see if any members resided in Berlin. I found three.

A few days after arriving, I sent emails to all three. I had no way of knowing whether I would get responses from any of them, or whether any of them would have the time to meet. Much to my delight, all three responded with gracious invitations to meet. My first meeting was with Nils Burkert. Nils owns a 1962 Series 62 Convertible. The directory lists Nils as residing in Berlin, but he had recently moved to Potsdam, just outside of Berlin. He was the last to respond to my email, by which time I had scheduled a trip to Potsdam. We made contact the day before my

trip, so by fortunate coincidence we were able to have lunch in Potsdam the next day. Unfortunately, Nils' car is located some distance from his residence, so I was unable to see the car. However, Nils and I had a good discussion of what it is like to be outside the U.S. trying to get parts for a Cadillac. We also had a good discussion of some of the issues that have recently been discussed on the CLC Discussion Forum, on which he participates. His CLC forum username is 6262.

My next visit was with Hilmar Schneider. Herr Schneider owns five Cadillacs, the oldest is a 1930 Seven-Passenger Sedan and the newest is a 1952 Series 60 Special. All of the cars are in beautiful condition with much of the restoration work having been done by Hilmar himself. He owns a garage with two lifts, and enough bays to store his five cars and have a workshop. His 1930 is an interesting car with all the options that make the classic cars from the 1930s so special including roll-up window shades and a cigar lighter in the dash that can extend all the way to the back seat. And everything works!

Hilmar's 1952 Series 60 Special is also a beautiful car; however he is having a little trouble with the hood hinges / springs. When closing the hood, it moves forward when nearing the closed position. He has posted about this issue on the CLC forum. His forum name is Hilarius. If anyone has any familiarity with this problem, send him a forum private message (PM).

When I arranged to meet with Hilmar, he told me he would pick me up at the train stop in his 1939 coupe, so it was unlikely that I would miss him. Sure enough, soon after alighting on the curb at the train stop, around the corner whips a 1939 Cadillac coupe. I was both amazed and delighted by the confidence with which Herr Schneider maneuvered his coupe around the narrow streets of his

neighborhood. Remember, this car has no power steering, no power brakes and manual transmission. He drives with the spirit of a young man, which is one of the things that made my visit with him so splendid. The hospitality extended to me by Herr Schneider and his wife, Elena, also made my visit special.





I was fortunate enough to be in Berlin when a four-day vintage car show was held. When I made contact with Matthias & Bettina Unger, I suggested that I meet them at the show. Instead, they suggested that I meet them at their home, and that we drive to the show in their 1957 Sedan DeVille. When I arrived at the Unger's home and was invited into the kitchen, I was transported to another place and time as the kitchen was completely decked out in 1950s / 1960s automobilia, right down to the Shell gasoline pump. The Ungers take their participation in the old car hobby to a serious level, including period dress at the car show.

The car show occupied several halls at the convention site. Inside the halls were many vintage European marques on display, as well as many car, parts and tool vendors. Outside the halls, the convention site included a large, circular field in and around which people could display their cars. The vast majority of the cars were of European manufacture, but there were several older American cars including three '59 Cadillacs.

The Unger's `57 Sedan DeVille rides on bias-ply tires. This made for an interesting ride on the streets of suburban Berlin. Another idiosyncrasy with the Unger's `57 is the brakes. The `57 uses the Bendix Hydro-Vac system. Matthias spent a small fortune having the unit rebuilt. However, when the brakes are applied, little to no braking occurs at first, then the brakes engage. So, while the pedal travel seems normal, brake


application goes from "off" to "on." If anyone has familiarity with this symptom of the Hydro-Vac brakes, please contact me at <u>cchwinter@cavtel.net</u> and I will relay the information to the Ungers.





I spent half a day with the Ungers, at their home and at the show, and I could not have enjoyed my time more. It was a beautiful day for a show, and the Ungers were most kind.

I had one more encounter with a Cadillac a few days before I left Berlin. I visited the Deutsches Technikmuseum which has a permanent exhibit devoted to automobiles. On display in this exhibit are a few engines including a Cadillac V-16. The engine number is 701588. The narrow V between the cylinders indicates it was built sometime during the years 1930 through 1937. There was no information on how this particular Cadillac engine wound up in a Berlin museum.

I enjoyed my trip to Berlin. The weather was mild and sunny for 19 out of the 21 days I was there. I saw a lot of sights, some touristy and some not. I have to say that visiting with Nils Burkert, the Schneiders and the Ungers really made for a memorable trip to Germany's capital city. I thank them all, and hope to be able to repay their hospitality in the future.





CARS AND COFFEE DURING HERSHEY WEEK BY SANDY KEMPER

Two years ago a new activity was introduced to the many enjoyments of Hershey Week: a "Cars and Coffee," sponsored by National Parts Depot at the AACA Museum. Held on Thursday and Friday from 7:30 am – 10:00 am, this event is a delightful opportunity to see some of the Museum's cars that are not on display in the Museum's galleries.



Behind the Museum, at the base of a long driveway, there are two sizeable featureless buildings. Inside one of them, this early morning event features plenty of coffee and pastries to partake with about fifty or so vehicles of the Museum's collection to see. Surprisingly, that's plenty of cars to view in what feels like a relatively small space. Although the building appears quite large from the outside, the autos are parked fairly tightly, so the overall effect is cramped yet impressive.

When I attended this Cars and Coffee in 2016, I recall seeing only one Cadillac. But this year, Cadillacs and LaSalles (an example pictured left) made up about ten percent of all of the cars on display and nearly all of them were beautiful examples of **The Standard of the World**. In addition there was a wide-ranging assortment of other vehicles. Some of these other cars are quite rare or unusual, while some others, although quite common at the time of their manufacture, are not often seen anymore.

This "Cars and Coffee" at the AACA Museum is a perfect way to start a day during Hershey Week. And it's a great way to whet one's appetite for perusing the Car Corral at the Hershey AACA Eastern Fall Meet.

CADILLACS AT THE RM AUCTIONS AT HERSHEY 2018 BY SANDY KEMPER

When it rains during the annual AACA Eastern Fall Meet in Hershey, PA, one must decide whether to put on the raingear and explore the Flea Market Fields and Car Corral regardless of the rain or find other interests in the Hershey Area that are inside or under cover of some sort. I chose the latter.

This year was the 12th year that RM/Sotheby's Auctions has held a sale at the Hershey Meet. The auction was conducted over two days at the historic Hershey Lodge, where bidders from fourteen countries and throughout the USA vied for the classic automobiles that crossed the auction stage. The auction began on Thursday evening. But prior to the start time, the opportunity for public viewing of the cars was available and one did not need to be a registered bidder to inspect them. The nearly 150 cars to be auctioned were all staged under two huge tents erected in the parking lots of the Hershey Lodge. This meant that despite the rain, there were wonderful cars to see in dry comfort. That's where I spent my time on the rainy Thursday afternoon.

Although there were innumerable classics of various makes that piqued my interest under the RM/Sotheby's tents, for this article I will focus on the Cadillacs. There were 17 Cadillacs on the block with the oldest being a 1917 Type 55 Opera Coupe and the newest was a 1961 Series 60 Special Sedan. Over half of the Cadillacs were 1930s vintage with four of them powered by V-16 engines and two with V-12s. All of the Cadillacs offered were sold at the auction and one of them, a 1930 V-16 Roadster, was the highest sale of the entire auction at \$495,000. The consignors of Cadillacs to RM/Sotheby's Auctions at Hershey 2018 had to have been pleased with the event.



Above left to right is a 1947 Series 62 Convertible, a CCCA Classic, sold for \$88,000, a 1938 V-16 Convertible Coupe Conversion auctioned at \$189,750 and a 1961 Series 60 Sedan gaveled at \$49,500.







The 1955 Series 62 Coupe deVille (above left) drew a lot of attention in its brilliant red paint, bright white interior and wire wheels. It sold for \$45,100. The 1931 V-8 Phaeton (above right) was a former CCCA National winner and looked like it could receive another such award easily. It sold for a little less than the estimated value (\$100,000-120,000) for \$96,800.



Above are two "big money" cars. The impeccable 1932 V-16 Limousine Brougham (left) was a rare V-16 model – the sole survivor of only seven examples built. It sold for \$143,000. Comparably rare, one of only two known to exist, was the 1935 V-12 Two Passenger Coupe (right). It was one of three cars that RM/Sotheby's displayed in the hallway of the Hershey Lodge befitting its superb appearance. It sold for \$203,000.







Here's a contrasting pair of V-16s (above left). The white 1938 Convertible Sedan sold for \$176,000 while the black 1940 Seven-Passenger Imperial Sedan only sold for \$66,000. The 1938 Series 75 Town Sedan (above right) was in very good condition and was marketed as good for caravans. It sold for \$33,000.



A very clean looking 1939 Series 60 Special Touring Sedan (above left) sold for \$42,900 and the 1941 Series 62 Convertible Sedan (above right) with a well-documented ownership history garnered a price of \$57,750.


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
