




## HAPPY 50TH ANNIVERSARY, CLC POTOMAC REGION

Some 15-20 potential members were in attendance including Juan Aranda, Bryce Frey, Richard Sisson and the late Steven Sisson, who served as the Region's first Director. The meeting was later featured, along with two photographs of the participants, in **The Self-Starter**.

On that cold but sunny day in 1969, Ron's neighborhood was transformed into an Apalachin, New York scene circa 1957 when Mafia bosses from all over arrived in their Cadillacs for a historic sit down. Unlike the Apalachin get-together, the vintage cars did not cause suspicion resulting in the arrival of the State Police at the residence, but rather a CLC Region was formed.






#### CAPITOL CITY CADILLAC CAPER THE SELF-STARTER JANUARY 1969

A number of Cad-LaSalle Club members and their friends from the Washington DC metropolitan area met informally on Sunday, January 5, 1969. Cars and wives were invited on an "as circumstances may permit" basis. Fortunately it was a beautiful sunny day, (20 degrees above) which prompted a turnout of 7 wives, 1 lady member, 18 men, and 10 Cadillacs. Shop talk, punch, hors d'oeuvres, colored slides of "out-of-the-area" cars by Ron VanGelderen, future planning, and admiring each other's cars were the order of the day. Consideration was given to future activities. A dinner was decided upon. Depending upon the support at that time, a tour, or a meet could be organized. ### 85 YEARS AGO THIS MONTH STORY BY RICHARD SILLS AND VINCE TALIANO

On January 11, 1934, Kempton Cadillac Corporation in Washington, DC ran a large ad in The Washington Post introducing the new 1934 Cadillac and LaSalle with their distinctive biplane bumpers. Ironically the ad's title stated that \*Progress Means **Change!...**, and change was soon to occur. On April 15, 1934, The Post reported Some news: "Akers to Open Cadillac Agency." We can only speculate as to why Kempton Cadillac ceased to exist, but an educated guess can be made, based on other reported facts.

The President of Kempton Cadillac was Robert Morris Kempton and its Chairman of the Board was his father-in law, Henry B. Tremaine. Apparently, Mr. Tremaine also owned a large share of the stock of the company. Henry, a resident of New York, was also the Chairman of the Board of the Aeolian Weber Piano and Pianola Company in New York, which had been founded by his father in 1887. Mr. Tremaine died suddenly on May 13, 1932, at age 66, while visiting his daughter and son-in-law in Washington. An article in the May 27, 1932 issue of The **Pelham Sun** reported that the bulk of his estate passed to a

The V-16, on usual, is current built to enfer. . . We sincertly believe that this is the granter annumement Cadillar has were made. So: these cars with atta thought is mind. You any's be disappediated,

trust for the benefit of his surviving widow.





After Mrs. Tremaine's death, the trust was to be divided into three equal shares, of which one went to Mrs. Kempton, one went to her sister, and one went to the children of Mrs. Kempton's brother.

The article also reported that Mr. Tremaine's will gave Mr. Kempton a "one-year option" to purchase his father-in-law's stock in Kempton Cadillac, for a price that the executors determined to be suitable. When his father-in-law died unexpectedly, Robert was in his early 40s, married, with two young children. He had just begun his second year of operating the dealership, and was now faced with an unexpected decision about buying out his father-in-law's share. The decision was forced on him during the darkest days of the Depression, when Cadillac and LaSalle sales plummeted in 1932-33. While the details are lost to history, it seems likely that when Mr. Kempton considered the size of the new obligation he would have to undertake if he bought the stock, and the general economic conditions then prevailing, he decided this would be a good time to consider an outside offer to acquire the company. Regardless of how the transition occurred, Floyd DeSoto Akers took over the representation of Cadillac and LaSalle automobiles later in 1934 under the name of Capitol Cadillac Company.

1932 Cadillac V-16 All-Weather Phaeton by Fisher sold new by Kempton Cadillac. The car, engine no. 1400208 – body no. 6 – style no. 27, is one of 13 Fisher-bodied all-weather phaetons built in 1932, and one of three that survive. The car sold for \$291,500 (inclusive of applicable buyer's fee) at the RM Auctions in Arizona in January 2013.

As the old saying goes, "*if you want to get something done, find a busy person to do it.*" Nothing could better describe our beloved outgoing CLC Potomac Region Director Vince Taliano. For 14 years, Vince has juggled family and a very travel-intensive career, all the while helping build one of the largest and fastest growing regions in the CLC. During this time, Vince has worn so many hats that he'd need to be a centipede to hang them all!

We have no idea how he did it. Vince was a true road-warrior. From 2010 to 2016, he had to be out of town for his job weekly, while juggling a family that includes his wife Robin and two sons, Jack and Michael – both of whom are into a wide array of youth sports. Since Vince took over, the Region has grown to a steady 185+ members, has won numerous Quill and Pen and CLC awards for the *Caddie Chronicle*, which Vince still edits, as well as the

Potomac Region website, which Vince still administers. Under his leadership we have had a steady stream of activities and events, not the least of which have been our themed Car Shows sponsored by Capitol Cadillac. Vince won the prestigious Henry M. Leland Award given by the CLC National organization in 2017 during the Tyson's Corner Grand National Meet. This award is given as earned (and not necessarily every year) to "an outstanding Cadillac & LaSalle Club member who has performed acts of great merit." Since its inception in 1990, it has only been awarded to 18 people.

Of course, while recognizing other out-going officers and folks assuming new roles in the recent **Caddie Chronicle**, Vince would not mention himself or the incredible achievements he has made while being our director (and chief cook and bottle washer!). Vince is a more decorated member on the National level than any CLC member – period. He's our "Four Star General!" He was a young guy taking over a club that was struggling for many years and took us up to the top with award winning shows, our **Caddie Chronicle** newsletter and so much more. The **Caddie Chronicle** newsletter is recognized world-wide.

I've been associated with the Potomac Region since 1973 and have seen our membership take off in the years since Vince has taken over. One of the main reasons for this I believe is because he was accessible to each club member that reached out to him, he's gives off a vibe that motivates individuals, and most of all he cares about our club. Vince implemented ideas to this club that at times members thought would be impossible years ago, specifically a Driving Tour, Automobilia Auctions and Spring & Fall shows at Capitol Cadillac with our Theme Shows that reached world-wide recognition and are still talked about to this day. I enjoy our trips to Hershey together, sharing stories about old cars and everyday conversations. I get excited when his number pops up on my phone. You know it's going to be something good as, "Hey Dan, I know where there's a `59 Cadillac for sale, go check it out!" or "I know where there are some parts for sale, might want to check it out!" Again, he's a loyal friend to all! I have some big shoes to fill and I'm sure he will be there to help guide me and our club in the right direction. I looked up to my father for many things in life and when I had a conversation with my dad many years ago about our club my dad said to me, "This guy [Vince] is going to take us somewhere, you watch and see," and damned if he hasn't. One thing is for sure, he will still be available to us as a member in good standing!

### From Secretary (and Caddie Chronicle associate newsletter editor) Sandy Kemper:

I have found it exceptional that Vince has produced an extraordinary newsletter each month for over 15 years. On average, each issue is 20 pages of Region business, classified ads and, this is really notable: mostly original or unique "found" Cadillac content. Also, it is incredible that Vince has managed to distribute the **Caddie Chronicle** on or before the first of nearly **every** month since he has been publishing it! And I continue to be astounded by the little-known things that Vince does that are associated with his primary tasks. One example is that he has compiled an index of all of the issues of the **Caddie Chronicle** that he has produced. This index lists each issue and each article by date, topic and author. Simply amazing! When did he find the time to compile this?





Similarly, Vince has created an extensive Region membership database which helps the Membership Director with the duties of that position tremendously. But what most members don't know is that Vince's database also helps to tabulate the car show judging results at our car shows. There isn't much time to count the ballots at our shows, but Vince's database makes the process much easier, faster and accurate. Further, if there is a question about a ballot indicating a vote for a member's car that appears to be in the wrong judging class, a quick search of the database usually confirms the year and model of the car to help determine the right judging class and to verify the correctness of the ballot. He is remarkable. And I could go on.

#### From long-time Potomac Region and 2017 CLC Grand National Treasurer Harry Scott:

I first met Vince at an organizational meeting of the Potomac Region just after being brought back from dormancy for a long period of time. From that very beginning, Vince had ideas and suggestions for growing and organizing the Region. He was a great help to the Director Bill Sessler with the many duties Bill found himself assigned after volunteering for the director position. Vince's assistance was purely that of being a team player and not for recognition or any aspirations of being in a leadership position. Upon Vince's assuming his leadership position he was a great help to me in moving the treasurer record keeping from paper and pencil to computer. It was apparent from the beginning of his tenure he had exceptional leadership and organizational skills. As mentioned previously Vince has also been blessed with good old fashioned "people skills" which makes it easy to call him a friend.

# <u>From Richard Sills, long-time Potomac Region Member and Car Show Emcee, Past-President of the CLC, Director of the CLC Central Penn Region and Board Member of the CLC, the CLC Museum and Research Center and AACA Museum:</u>

In addition to the leadership Vince provided as Director of the Potomac Region, his efforts made our *Caddie Chronicle* Region newsletter into a publication of international quality and recognition. Not only does the newsletter cover local events and national CLC activities, it also attracts fascinating stories from people who live thousands of miles from the borders of the Potomac Region. It has included well-researched in-depth articles about a wide variety of Cadillac-related subjects. Several that come to mind are the articles about (1) General Patton's Cadillac and the mysteries that surround it, (2) the 1947 Fleetwood purchased from Capitol Cadillac and presented to Speaker of the House Sam Rayburn as a gift from his colleagues in Congress, and (3) the complete researched history of Washington, D.C. Cadillac dealerships going back to 1903, when new Cadillacs shared a showroom with bicycles. There are countless more outstanding articles, far too many to mention. Vince's newsletters have gained regular readers from all over the world, and have reflected great credit on the Potomac Region.

Of the ten award categories listed above, nine of them are CLC recognized awards. Of those nine, eight are major awards (the Website Merit Award being more of a "junior" award) and of those eight, seven are for personal recognition as compared to the Norm Uhlir Regional Activity Award which is, technically, an award given to the region, but in reality, without Vince in charge of running the Region, the Region would not have won the award in 2008. So, with eight major CLC awards to his personal credit, Vince has the distinction of having won more major CLC awards than any other member in the 60-year history of the CLC – an amazing accomplishment and all well-deserved!

In addition to all of the above, Vince has brought together a number of national CLC folks, and other notables as well, in a variety of ways for the overall betterment of the CLC and the Cadillac collector car hobby in general over the years. As examples of these above-and-beyond efforts, in 2007 Vince invited Ron VanGelderen (two-time Past President of the CLC) to return to the Potomac Region (a Region Ron helped to found in 1969) to speak at the Fall Capitol Cadillac Show which featured the LaSalle automobile theme show called the *Legacy of LaSalle* event. During the speech Ron, pictured left, spoke on the history of the LaSalle automobile as well as told the story behind the book "*LaSalle, Cadillac's Companion* 

*Car*" he co-authored with Matt Larson which is the most comprehensive book ever published on the subject.

Then, in 2008, Vince, along with Daniel Jobe, spearheaded the push for the most ambitious Fall Theme Show in the history of the Potomac Region with the *Cadillac Dream Cars* event. Thanks to Vince's dedication to the event and his impressive management talents the show was a total success! For the first time, both of the only known surviving 1953 LeMans concept cars (#3 & #4) were together again, on display in the Capitol Cadillac showroom along with the 1956 Cadillac Maharani (a 1956 Motorama show car), a 1903 Cadillac from the General Motors Historical Collection, the Centennial Cien show car and the 2003 Cadillac Sixteen, then a current concept vehicle. Attending the show were Charles Barnette from Texarkana, Texas, who had researched the 1953 LeMans concept cars for David Temple's book, "*GM Motorama*", and Tomajean Haugerud, the daughter of Floyd Akers, the man who purchased the Capitol Cadillac dealership in 1934 (the dealership is still owned by the family and is currently run by Daniel Jobe, grandson of Floyd Akers) and who also owned LeMans #3 during the 1950's. Mrs. Haugerud drove the LeMans in the 1950s.


