### IN MEMORIAM: MARY BRILL BY SPENCER CHAPLAIN AND VINCE TALIANO

Long-standing CLC Potomac Region member Mary Brill of Irvington, VA recently passed away at the age of 75. Mary's late husband, Alfred "Buddy" Brill, was in the top echelon of Cadillac sales professionals in the U.S. While employed at Lindsay Cadillac in Alexandria, VA for 30 years, he was one of 20 sales executives recognized by Cadillac Motor Car Division in 1992 for outstanding sales production. Through the years, Buddy was affectionately referred to as "Mr. Cadillac" by many friends and associates. After he passed away in 2005, Mary maintained her Club membership until the time of her death. In 2009, she attended the Spring Car Show at Capitol Cadillac in Greenbelt, MD with her 2007 XLR and won the Ladies' Choice Award (pictured right).

In more recent years, she attended car shows in the Northern Neck of Virginia with CLC member Spencer Chaplain (pictured below) and her 1958 Eldorado Biarritz. As was the case with the 2009 show, it started raining at that event as well. The convertible top hadn't gone up in 20 years, but it worked flawlessly that day!

In addition to their love of cars (they owned over 20 at one point), Mary & Buddy also owned B&B Builders, where Buddy built many of the custom-made homes in Reedville, Sunnybank and Irvington, VA. In addition, they owned a charter boat fishing company out of Pt. Lookout, MD for many years.

The Region sends its condolences to Mary's son, Jimmy, her family and friends. Rest in Peace, Mary!









### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I enjoyed seeing the 1963-vintage photos of Capitol Cadillac in Washington, DC in your newsletter. Thank you for publishing them.

From my research about the distribution system for new Cadillacs, I now know of three 1963 Cadillacs that Capitol Cadillac purchased. One was a Style J (Coupe de Ville) in Color 52 (Royal Maroon); one was a Style M (Sixty-Special) in Color 12 (Aspen White) with a Green Chambord cloth and leather interior, making a somewhat unusual combination, and one was a Coupe de Ville in Color 24 (Basque Blue) with Dark Blue Clarendon cloth and leather. The three were shipped from Detroit in the period November 1962-February 1963.

It appears that the distribution territory run by Capitol Cadillac may have been allotted something around 1,200-1,400 Cadillacs for that model year, so the odds of any of the three cars that I found being in any of the photos you published are low, and zero if those photos were taken before November 1962! Of those roughly 1,300 1963 Cadillacs, it's very difficult to say how many Capitol kept for its DC store and how many it transferred to the stores in Alexandria, VA, Bethesda, MD or other Cadillac dealers in that territory (which may have included the dealers in Fredericksburg, VA, Front Royal, VA and Winchester, VA).

I hope you might be able to share a little more about those photos in your next issue. For example, was the new car showroom in those photos on the second floor?

**SECRETARY'S REMARKS:** The minutes from the previous meeting were not reviewed since they were published and distributed to all members in the May 2024 newsletter.



# POLICE INVESTIGATING ARMED CARJACKING OF 1968 CADILLAC DEVILLE

The 911 caller reported a tall black male wearing a black hoodie, black mask and blue jeans stole a green 1968 Cadillac Deville at gunpoint. No known injuries were reported.

Police are investigating the incident and updates will be provided when they become available. The vehicle is a green 1968 Cadillac Deville bearing Maryland registration tags.

# 25 YEARS OF THE ESCALADE BY THE GENERAL MOTORS HERITAGE COLLECTION

Ironically, the big image boost that Cadillac worked hard to achieve in the 1990s didn't come from a car but actually from a truck, the first in Cadillac history. This truck was the 1999 Cadillac Escalade, an upscale clone of the posh Yukon Denali sport-utility wagon from the sibling division GMC and was approved for production just ten months after being proposed. The name Escalade refers to a siege warfare tactic of scaling defensive walls or ramparts with the aid of ladders or siege towers.

The 1999 Cadillac Escalade was an answer to the success of Lincoln's Navigator SUV and the potential of offshore, big SUV "wannabes." Sales of full-size sport-utility





vehicles were growing faster in the late 1990s compared to compact and midsize SUVs. Recently, Hagerty Magazine published an article titled <a href="How the Escalade Out-Maneuvered the Navigator at the Dawn of the SUV Age">How the Escalade Out-Maneuvered the Navigator at the Dawn of the SUV Age</a>. In the piece, they stated "the Escalade has done what several generations of super-sedans couldn't do for Cadillac—make the badge relevant again and get younger people into Cadillacs in large numbers. Car and Driver Magazine's prediction had come true; the 2002 Escalade really was the cornerstone of the revival of the brand, which in the coming years saw more exciting models like the CTS-V, ATS, and CT5-V join the lineup. Conversely, you could argue that the second-gen Navigator, introduced for 2003, was the opposite. It preceded the general neglect that the Lincoln brand still suffers from."





The 1999 Cadillac Escalade's engine was a 350 CID (5.7L) Overhead Value, Multi-Port Injection V8 that produces 255 hp@4600 rpm and 330 lb. ft. of Torque@ 2800 rpm. The Bore/Stroke was 4.00x3.48 with a Compression Ratio of 9.4:1. It was capable of towing up to 6,500 pounds and included the standard AutoTrac four-wheel drive that could be used on dry pavement. The Escalade included the Cadillac-style grille and interior trim, which used real wood and the same leather found in Cadillac passenger cars.



Cadillac executives were publicly baffled, but privately delighted when sports heroes, recording artists and a few movie stars made the \$46,525 "Slade" their ride of choice, often customized with gold trim and outsized wheels. Despite such debatable alterations -- or maybe because of them -- the Escalade made it cool again to own a Cadillac.

To commemorate the 25-year anniversary of the Escalade, the CLC is looking to form a chapter. Research of Club membership shows that 154 distinct members own Escalades with 17 of them owning two or more. The overall list includes quite a few prominent members who would likely enjoy belonging to an Escalade Chapter. The creation of a chapter would further unit these members and appeal to Escalade owners not yet CLC members, of which there are many. 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
